

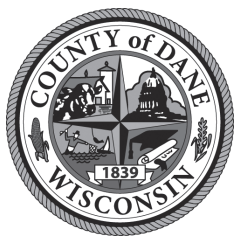

# City of Madison & Dane County Combined Campaign Facts

## What is the Combined Campaign?

- An annual workplace campaign conducted by the City of Madison and Dane County employees.
- A once-a-year fundraising effort benefiting people with disabilities and disease, the elderly, victims of abuse and violence, the homeless and hungry, the environment, human and consumer rights, economic development, educational opportunities, and emergency relief.

## What are my choices?

The campaign is a combined effort of seven umbrella organizations that represent more than 300 local, statewide, national, and international nonprofit charities from which to choose.

## Can I specify who will receive my contribution?

Yes, the choice is yours and contributions go to the charity/charities you choose. Simply select the charities you would like to support and designate your contribution to them on your pledge form. You will find charity code numbers in this booklet. You cannot contribute through the Combined Campaign to a charity that is not listed in this booklet.

## Is my contribution tax-deductible?

Yes, as allowed by law. Only umbrella organizations and charities that qualify for federal tax-deduction status are allowed to participate in this campaign. The Pension Protection Act of 2006 now requires taxpayers who claim deductions for charitable donations to provide proof of all contributions should they be audited. Be sure to keep a copy of your pledge form for tax purposes. In addition, if you choose payroll contribution, keep copies of all pay stubs and/or other documents from your employer that indicate the amounts you have given to charities. If you contribute by cash or check, keep all receipts, cancelled checks, and/or bank statements that verify the amounts and recipients of your contributions. (The campaign will mail official receipts for cash and check gifts of \$250 or more. Receipts for gifts of less than \$250 are available upon request.) If you have any questions about tax deductions for charitable gifts, consult a tax professional.

## Online:

1. Visit <https://combined-campaign.countyofdane.com/>
2. Click the link based on your work assignment and following the log in instructions.
3. Select and add any umbrellas or nonprofits you'd like to designate funds to. You can designate different dollar amounts for each nonprofit or umbrella you're directing funds to.
4. Select your Payment Method
5. Review and submit your gift.
6. Thank you! A confirmation email with the details of your gift will be emailed to you from [publicsector@uwdc.org](mailto:publicsector@uwdc.org)

## Paper forms:

1. Decide how much you'd like to give.
2. Decide how you'd like to give - payroll, cash, check.
3. Decide who you'd like to give to:
  - a. The campaign overall to be shared among the 7 umbrellas that are part of the campaign.
  - b. To specific umbrella organizations.
  - c. To specific nonprofits in the campaign - fill in their charity code from their listing in the booklet.
4. Designate your contribution for each nonprofit or umbrella you're directing funds to.
5. Be sure to fill in your name, department number, and address.
6. Then take a picture on your phone or make a copy for your own records and give the original to your coordinator along with your payment if applicable.

### Access to Community Services



With support from **Goodwill SCWI** job coaches, Chris Johnson (CJ) has thrived at his job for more than 20 years. A popular figure at the downtown brew pub where he works, CJ's employers say he's the best kind of employee: reliable, always on time, hard-working, and friendly with both co-workers and customers.

In between his work duties, CJ usually finds time for dancing, encouraging everyone around him to join in the fun. His musical interests often lead to song. From CJ's perspective, singing Roll Out The Barrel and laying the silverware are his two favorite things about his job. And from the perspective of his co-workers, CJ is one of the best parts of everyone's job.

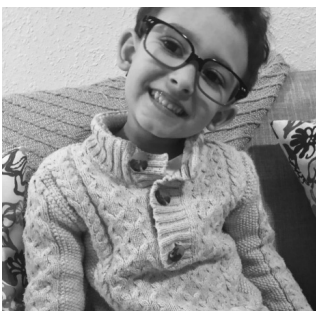
### Community Shares of Wisconsin

**Working Capital for Community Needs (WCCN), OutReach LGBTQ+ Community Center, Bayview Foundation,** and countless other CSW

organizations stepped up in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. WCCN raised over \$50,000 to provide PPE and food support for the local community and beyond. OutReach increased the Willma's Fund to award over \$50,000 in support to low income and homeless LGBTQ+ people in Dane County. Bayview Foundation provided on-site COVID vaccine clinics for Bayview residents and also provided 700 hours of virtual school and reliable internet to children in the Bayview community.



### Creating Healthier Communities

Charles is a bright and high-spirited 6-year-old who always radiates positive energy. He is the biggest fan of baseball and, more specifically, the Milwaukee Brewers.

A certified vision screening from **Prevent Blindness Wisconsin** community volunteers changed Charles' life. If not for his preschool vision screening, his astigmatism and

refractive amblyopia (lazy eye) may have gone undetected and resulted in permanent vision loss.

"I can see better to hit the baseball, just like the Brewers!" said Charles as soon as he put on his new glasses.

Charles' mom says "We would absolutely recommend a Children's Vision Screening. Having his eye problem diagnosed early on has been a game-changer. We are very grateful for Prevent Blindness Wisconsin and all they have done for our family."

## EarthShare



Antonio Butts, executive director of Walnut Way Conservation Corps, has long been interested in clean energy as a way to build community cohesion throughout Milwaukee's north side. His interest came to fruition in 2019 with a Solar for Good grant from **RENEW Wisconsin** that helped Walnut Way fund a 25 kW solar project across four different buildings. This solar project provides energy to Fondy's Farmers Market that attracts thousands of visitors each summer, Walnut Way's community garden, a commercial kitchen

that aims to address food insecurity throughout the community, and their administrative offices.

Antonio believes education and outreach are the gateways to economic mobility and equity for underrepresented communities, and these projects are a positive step towards those goals. Antonio envisions clean energy as a catalyst for global-scale social change, and he looks forward to continuing that in his own community.

## United Way of Dane County



While Dane County remains a top place to live, raise a family, and retire, for BIPOC neighbors (including Black, Indigenous, Latinx, Southeast Asian, and people of color), education, income, and health inequities and disparities remain consistent. Unfortunately, in Dane County the color of your skin and the ZIP code in which you live have a significant impact on your quality of life, life expectancy, and a wide range of health outcomes.

That is why United Way of Dane County set a goal to decrease racial disparities in Dane County by providing equitable access to affordable, accessible, and culturally safe health care. In 2021, in programs that address the needs of BIPOC communities, 87% of participants saw improved health outcomes. In maternal child health programs, 91% of participants saw improved health outcomes. 583 people received health insurance coverage through our HealthConnect premium assistance program. United Way of Dane County continues to work toward a Dane County absent of racial health disparities.

Aulia realized it was her dream to follow her entrepreneurial spirit and work on her business full-time. In 2019 she quit her day job and opened a food kiosk in the canteen of her former university.

Thinking strategically about the future of her business, Aulia decided to seek out guidance in managing business finances and online marketing.

She joined MicroMentor, a **Mercy Corps** mentoring program, in September 2019. With a boost in confidence and the tools and guidance she needed in hand, Aulia's business is growing and she is looking forward to a bright future.

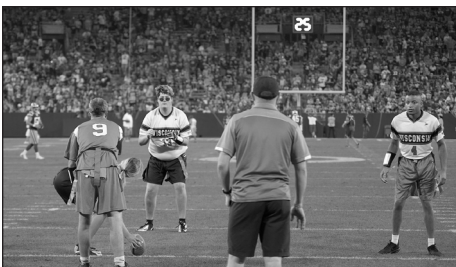

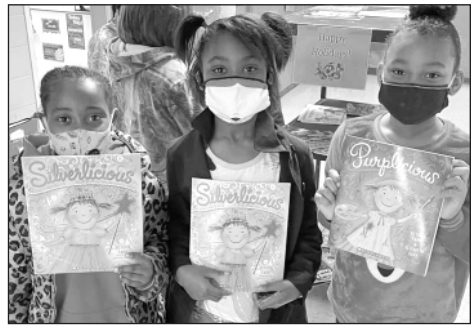
