City of Madison & Dane County Combined Employee Giving Campaign Facts

What is the Combined Campaign?

- An annual workplace campaign conducted by the City of Madison and Dane County employees.
- A once-a-year fundraising effort benefiting people with disabilities and disease, the elderly, victims of abuse and violence, the homeless and hungry, the environment, human and consumer rights, economic development, educational opportunities, and emergency relief.

What are my choices?

The campaign is a combined effort of six umbrella organizations that represent more than 290 local, statewide, national, and international nonprofit charities from which to choose.

Can I specify who will receive my contribution?

Yes, the choice is yours and contributions go to the charity/charities you choose. Simply select the charities you would like to support and designate your contribution to them on your pledge form. You will find charity code numbers in this booklet. You cannot contribute through the Combined Campaign to a charity that is not listed in this booklet.

Is my contribution tax-deductible?

Yes, as allowed by law. Only umbrella organizations and charities that qualify for federal tax-deduction status are allowed to participate in this campaign. The Pension Protection Act of 2006 now requires taxpayers who claim deductions for charitable donations to provide proof of all contributions should they be audited. Be sure to keep a copy of your pledge form for tax purposes. In addition, if you choose payroll contribution, keep copies of all pay stubs and/or other documents from your employer that indicate the amounts you have given to charities. If you contribute by cash or check, keep all receipts, cancelled checks, and/or bank statements that verify the amounts and recipients of your contributions. (The campaign will mail official receipts for cash and check gifts of \$250 or more. Receipts for gifts of less than \$250 are available upon request.) If you have any questions about tax deductions for charitable gifts, consult a tax professional.

How To Pledge

2. Click Give Online and follow the log in instructions based on your work assignment.
3. Select and add any umbrella organization or nonprofit you would like to designate funds to. You can allocate different dollar amounts to each nonprofit or umbrella you choose to support.
4. Select your Payment Method.
5. Review and submit your gift.
6. Thank you! A confirmation email with the details of your gift will be emailed to you from publicsector@uwdc.org.

Paper forms:

1. Decide how much you'd like to give.
2. Decide how you'd like to give - payroll, cash, check.
3. Decide who you'd like to give to:
 - a. The campaign overall to be shared among the six umbrellas participating in the campaign.
 - b. To specific umbrella organizations.
 - c. To specific nonprofits in the campaign - fill in their charity code from their listing in the booklet.
4. Be sure to fill in your name, department number, and address.
5. Then take a picture on your phone or make a copy for your own records and give the original form to your coordinator along with your payment if applicable.

Community Shares of Wisconsin

With 5 home sales in 2023, MACLT was able to support 5 very low-income families between 30% and 50% Area Median Income (AMI) on their journey to homeownership. Each of these home buyers were first-time homeowners and were able to leverage both our affordable resale formula and down payment assistance to get to the closing table. To date, we have assisted 123 low-income families in achieving homeownership with our 62 permanently affordable homes.

Homeowners in our program have shared these words from their experience: "As a single-income family of six people, we would normally be unable to afford a house in Madison. Our MACLT condo has given us a beautiful neighborhood to live in, with wide open shared yards for my four children to play in. With our income, there's no way we would have such a generous setup in Madison apart from the CLT."

Earthshare

In partnership with volunteer organizations and individuals around the globe, Ocean Conservancy's International Coastal Cleanup® engages people to remove trash from the world's beaches and waterways, identify the sources of debris and change the behaviors. Over the past year, nearly 470,000 volunteers across 97 countries picked up over 4,000 tons of trash and plastics. These cleanups took place everywhere from remote coastlines to crowded beaches, and every single item collected is one fewer item that ended up in the ocean.

Over half of the volunteers tracked their collection amounts using Clean Swell®, contributing to a vast database that informs policy solutions to the ocean plastics crisis.

MKE Urban Stables

After serving in Vietnam, Glenn Perry struggled to adjust to civilian life, battling PTSD and feeling left behind as friends moved on. Like many veterans, he faced challenges in finding support, with 22 veterans dying by suicide each day. However, Glenn found purpose through MKE Urban Stables' Equine-Assisted Therapy Program. The program helps veterans connect with horses as a therapeutic process. Over eight weeks, Glenn's experience with the horses provided him with a new outlook, allowing him to heal and return to the stables for continued support.

Global Impact

Esther and her family live in Haiti one of the most food-insecure places on the planet. Hunger in Haiti has spiked over the last several years



Esther

– devastatingly, nearly half of families in the country are living in acute hunger, many on the brink of starvation. Esther's parents already experienced the heartbreaking loss of one child to starvation – so when Esther became ill, they did everything they could to get help. They walked an hour to reach the Real Hope for Haiti Rescue Center. Esther was quickly identified as severely malnourished and admitted for inpatient care. The clinic provided MannaPack®

Potato-D – a fortified potato and soy meal formula specifically designed to complement rehydration and boost recovery from diarrhea. Within days, Esther was feeling so much better.
