City of Madison & Dane County Combined Employee Giving Campaign Facts

What is the Combined Campaign?

- An annual workplace campaign conducted by the City of Madison and Dane County employees.
- A once-a-year fundraising effort benefiting people with disabilities and disease, the elderly, victims of abuse and violence, the homeless and hungry, the environment, human and consumer rights, economic development, educational opportunities, and emergency relief.

What are my choices?

The campaign is a combined effort of six umbrella organizations that represent more than 270 local, statewide, national, and international nonprofit charities from which to choose.

How do I learn more?

- Contact your campaign coordinator to help answer any questions or concerns.

Can I specify who will receive my contribution?

Yes, the choice is yours and contributions go to the charity/charities you choose. Simply select the charities you would like to support and designate your contribution to them on your pledge form. You will find charity code numbers in this booklet. You cannot contribute through the Combined Campaign to a charity that is not listed in this booklet.

Is my contribution tax-deductible?

Yes, as allowed by law. Only umbrella organizations and charities that qualify for federal tax-deduction status are allowed to participate in this campaign. The Pension Protection Act of 2006 now requires taxpayers who claim deductions for charitable donations to provide proof of all contributions should they be audited. Be sure to keep a copy of your pledge form for tax purposes. In addition, if you choose payroll contribution, keep copies of all pay stubs and/or other documents from your employer that indicate the amounts you have given to charities. If you contribute by cash or check, keep all receipts, cancelled checks, and/or bank statements that verify the amounts and recipients of your contributions. (The campaign will mail official receipts for cash and check gifts of \$250 or more. Receipts for gifts of less than \$250 are available upon request.) If you have any questions about tax deductions for charitable gifts, consult a tax professional.

How To Pledge

Online:

- 2. Click Give Online and follow the log in instructions based on your work assignment.
- Select and add any umbrella organization or nonprofit you would like to designate funds to. You can allocate different dollar amounts to each nonprofit or umbrella you choose to support.
- 4. Select your Payment Method.
- 5. Review and submit your gift.
- 6. Thank you! A confirmation email with the details of your gift will be emailed to you from publicsector@uwdc.org.
- *If your user id or password do not work, please email: publicsector@uwdc.org for support.

Paper forms:

- 1. Decide how much you'd like to give.
- 2. Decide how you'd like to give payroll, cash, check.
- 3. Decide who you'd like to give to:
 - a. The campaign overall to be shared among the six umbrellas participating in the campaign.
 - b. To specific umbrella organizations.
 - c. To specific nonprofits in the campaign fill in their charity code from their listing in the booklet.
- 4. Be sure to fill in your name, department number, and address.
- Then take a picture on your phone or make a copy for your own records and give the original form to your coordinator along with your payment if applicable.

At United Way of Dane County, we help young people realize their full potential by breaking down barriers to success. Through our Youth Opportunity impact area and partnerships like the Children's Dyslexia Center (CDC), we foster the skills and confidence students need to succeed.

One recent graduate shared how the program opened new doors for her: "Once I started in the CDC program, I realized that I had the option to learn how to live with dyslexia and grow my skills in reading and writing... I realized there was a whole world

of excitement and imagery waiting for me within the pages of books." She graduated with a 3.7 GPA, was part of National Honor Society and takes with her the love for learning.

Community Shares of Wisconsin



Ken Feltz, a multi-generational farmer in Wisconsin's Little Plover River watershed, cares deeply for his land. When controversy over local water resources arose, he stepped up to join a public/private partnership. There, he met the Wisconsin Wetlands Association.

A collaboration was born. Together, they explored how wetlands could improve his farm and address the river's water issues. Ken has since implemented significant changes: converting irrigated row crops to pasture for better infiltration, and strategically filling ditches to restore wetlands and groundwater levels.

"The best part is working with partners," says Ken. "We're collaboratively coming up with solutions to improve our farm's bottom line and our community's wetlands and waterways." He's just getting started.

Helen Keller International:
Vitamin A Improves Health for
Children in Mali Four-year-old
Abdoul Aziz Coulibaly, living
in a small Malian village, was
often sick and, alarmingly, lost
most of his vision after sunset.
Unbeknownst to his family,
Abdoul suffered from nyctalopia,

or night blindness. Vision loss and frequent infections are telltale signs of a vitamin A deficiency in young children. When kids don't get enough of this vital nutrient, their developing vision and immune systems are put at serious risk. Helen Keller International provides a simple, inexpensive solution: high-dose vitamin A capsules every six months until a child's fifth birthday. Immediately after his first dose, Abdoul's parents were stunned. Not only did his vision quickly improve, but his appetite increased, and he began playing more with other children-even after dark. This vital intervention helps children like Abdoul grow up healthier.

America's Charities

Support for America's Charities creates success stories across the United States and throughout the world. Even small donations make a big difference. For example, a \$1 per month donation funds five minutes of lifesaving children's cancer research by Cancer Research for Children - CureSearch. A \$1 per pay period donation helps the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation provide 10 remembrance cards to the families of fallen firefighters on the anniversary of their firefighters' death. From protecting animals with Humane Society International to protecting human rights with Amnesty International of the USA, you can be part of a success story with America's Charities.

CHC: Creating Healthier Communities

Luann remembers a time in her life when she had three diagnoses, tried 50 different psychiatric medications, and made multiple suicide attempts. She was hospitalized 25 times. In 1997, she saw a sign for a local NAMI and with nothing left to lose she walked in seeking help. She never left.

She eventually worked her way up to become a Program Director and has used her story to advocate for others. Luann has been in recovery for 20 years and serves NAMI Wisconsin as a state trainer for three different signature programs. NAMI gave her more than just hope. NAMI gave her a purpose. NAMI provided her with a safe environment, treated her as an asset, and supported her in her recovery.

Alliance for the Great Lakes Adopt-a-Beach Program

For more than 30 years, the Alliance for the Great Lakes has run the Adopt-a-Beach program, the largest of its kind in the Great Lakes region. This year, more than 10,000 volunteers will collect more than 500,000 pieces

of litter from Great Lakes shorelines and waterways in nearly 1,000 individual events, across all five Great Lakes in all eight Great Lakes states. We collect data of every piece of litter removed and share this data with researchers and scientists across the globe.
